This is a very simple and extremely important assignment. You may want to watch the lessons on Shutter Speed and Aperture before you do it so you will know what you are looking for.

1. Grab your camera and take a quick picture of anything. Using the camera's file viewing system, find the following information about that picture:

- A. Shutter Speed
- B. Aperture

You may have to look around the menu system or a button called "info" but most cameras will have this information available somewhere.

2. Most photo editing programs will have a way to look at the shutter speed and aperture in what is called META DATA, or the shooting information embedded in the file of your image. Open the picture in a photo viewing program such as Photoshop, if possible. Find the shutter speed and aperture information in the file's META Data. This is important because it will help you trouble shoot your images in the future if something doesn't look right, or if something looks great, you can review these numbers and learn.

- B. White Balance
- C. Compression Quality
- D. Metering Mode
